2006-2007 Interest Groups

Please check the box for groups that interest you.

- Babysitting Co-op***: Babysitting by adults exchanged on a point system. One meeting per year is required so that parents get to know each other.
- Bunco Group**: This group meets monthly for a fun night of Bunco hosted in a member's home.
- Euchre Group**: This group meets monthly on Saturday nights to play Euchre and enjoy food, beverages and conversation.
- Book Discussion Group***: Join other members for conversations about selected books. This is a chance to read something new and share thoughts.
- Bowling**: This is a fun way to get out of the house, socialize, and enjoy a game of bowling. Group meets regularly and childcare is provided.
- Dinner Club***: Gather together monthly or every other month in a member's home to enjoy a themed meal.
- Gardening Group***: Share your gardening skills with other interested members.
- Family Fun**: Parents (or Grandparents) with small children meet monthly for field trips, outings and parties.
- Friendship Circle**: Provide meals for Newcomer members who have recently had a baby, lost a loved one, or are undergoing otherwise difficult circumstances. Members of the Circle usually provide one meal each year.
- Games/Games***: Share an evening every other month playing a variety of fun games. The host or co-host volunteers their home(s) and organizes the game.
- Get Moving – Bike Riding**: The Plymouth Community ride shows you how to get around to all the area focal points by bicycle and minimizes sharing the road with fast moving motorists.
- Get Moving – Walking***: A walking club that explores many of the neighborhoods in the Plymouth community while chatting with others and getting to know each other.
- Ladies Night Out**: Get together monthly at a local restaurant for good dining and conversation.
- Men's Poker Night**: This group meets monthly on Fridays for low stakes Poker, snacks and beverages.
- Out-to-Lunch Bunch**: Meet once a month to have lunch in a new or old spot while catching up with friends.
- Philanthropic Activities***: A variety of service oriented projects for adults and children that aim to benefit the community of Plymouth.
- Playgroups – all ages**: Parents have coffee and chat children play. These small groups vary in size, kids' age and meet in member's homes, parks, or indoor play areas. You choose the group and day that best suits you.
- Scrapbook Night**: This small amateur group meets once or twice a month, for a couple of stress-free hours cutting, pasting, and creating a special memory book. No art experience necessary. Bring your own supplies.
- U-Prep It! Advance Meal Planning**: Get together with fellow members at *Dinner Thyme* to assemble 8 meals in less than two hours
